


PROJECT SCOPE

- Widen 8.5 miles of I-64
- 4 lanes to 6 lanes
- Add one HOT Lane, EB/WB
- Shoulder lanes (4th lane), EB/WB
- New High-Rise Bridge
- Replace GBB Bridge
- 6 bridge widenings

THE NEW HIGH RISE BRIDGE

How big are the piles that will be used to build the new High Rise Bridge?

- (216) 36-inch square concrete piles
- (66) 66-inch diameter concrete cylinder piles
- (32) 24-inch concrete piles at the abutments


The piles, tubs, and abutments are all being produced at Coastal Precast. Many of the piles will be transported by barge right down the right to the construction site.






VDDT Virginia Department of Transportation Typical Section - Bridge Widenings

I-64 Southside Widening & High Rise Bridge, Phase I










Existing Great Bridge Blvd Bridge (Looking East)


WORK ZONE CONGESTION MITIGATION

- Variable Message Boards (VMS)
- Speed limit reduced to 55 mph (coming soon!)
- I-64: Minimum two 11-ft lanes; 9-ft right shoulder
- Pull off areas at 1 mile maximum spacing
- Temporary acceleration/deceleration lanes to and from work space
- Retained access for emergency incident response vehicles
- Wireless closed circuit television cameras
- Incident Management Plan
- Full-time Incident Management Coordinator Robert (Danny) Plott
- 24/7 Towing/Wrecker

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UPCOMING CONSTRUCTION TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Each week's scheduled lane and ramp closures can be found on the project website on the <u>Traffic</u> <u>Alerts</u> page
- Intermittent day-time flagging operations at Tennyson Avenue, Military Highway, Yadkin Road and the Great Bridge Boulevard ramp as construction crews prepare work zones
- Intermittent stoppages on Military Highway Northbound and Southbound at the I-64 overpass as crews begin the bridge widening over Military Highway from 9 a.m to 3 p.m and 5 p.m. to 7 a.m. Stoppages can last up to 20 minutes and will continue until further notice. Updates can be found on this website and roadway signage





Upcoming Lane Closures

I-64 single-lane closures both directions between South Military Highway and Battlefield Boulevard, February 4-8, 7 p.m. to 5 a.m.

 Intermittent day-time flagging operations at Tennyson Avenue, Military Highway, Yadkin Road and Great Bridge Boulevard ramp, February 4-8, 9 a.m to 3 p.m.

Motorist should expect intermittent stoppages on Military Highway Northbound and Southbound at the I-64

overpass as crews begin the bridge widening over Military Highway from 9 a.m to 3 p.m and 5 p.m. to 7 a.m. Stoppages can last up to 20 minutes and will continue until further notice. Updates can be found on this websi

and roadway signage.

UPCOMING CONSTRUCTION TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Speed Limit Reduced to 55 mph on I-64 After the work zone areas are established, the speed limit along the I-64 work zone will be reduced to 55 mph.
- Restricted Access at Libertyville Road and Bainbridge Boulevard Intersection Beginning in March - Beginning in March, access to Bainbridge Boulevard from Libertyville Road will be restricted. Additionally, there will be no turns from Bainbridge Boulevard onto Libertyville Road. Motorists traveling on Bainbridge Boulevard will be able to continue straight through the Libertyville Road intersection. This closure will last approximately 10-12 months for construction of the new High Rise Bridge.
